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Our core business is teaching and learning. This document has been developed as a guideline to support positive relationships within the school community. Our **ARROW** values and learner attributes of the 3Cs are fundamental in how we work together to ensure the best outcomes for students at WPPS. We are developing our students as self-managers and are also appreciative of volunteers who support our class programs.

Following Our Code of Conduct looks like:

- Being friendly and courteous; working together in a mutually trusting civilised and respectful manner
- Listening to others; maintaining non-aggressive behaviour
- Valuing the privacy of students, families and staff
- Communicating and responding positively to teacher communications
- Valuing and respecting the expertise and experience of staff
- Being open to new ideas and the viewpoints of others
- Dealing with issues constructively using the *Guidelines for Dealing with Issues* document
- Using social media positively
- Using the school's existing channels of communication to send a message to your child
- Participating in school life with positive intent
- Accessing school apps, emails and reading newsletters
- Keeping to timelines and RSVPs
- Making appointments and adhering to time constraints
- Listening to your child with an understanding that this is one perspective
- Supporting school decision making, adhering to procedures and supporting the school uniform code
- Encouraging children to be self-managers
- Taking ownership for one's actions and taking responsibility

Not following our Code of Conduct looks like:

- Being aggressive, rude, intimidating or violent
- Staying beyond the drop off time without signing in
- Blaming others
- Messaging/texting students during school time
- Being closed to the perspective of others
- Not being proactive in the education of your child
- Not following individual classroom and whole school communication protocols
- Not supporting school policies and procedures
- Gossiping in the community and/ or on social media and not following the *Guidelines for Dealing with Issues* document (see over)
- Approaching other people's children to discuss an issue
- Being rude to the people who work in the school
- Being rude to volunteers, coaches, officials and opposition at school sports events

We thank all families for following these guidelines to ensure a safe environment for all. Not following this Code of Conduct could result in restricted access to the classroom and school events such as sports. Any parents/carers staying after this time, to support learning programs, will need to sign in at the office.
